## Job Purpose

The Swiss PGA Performance Managers' main responsibility is to look after the interests of the Playing Members of the Swiss PGA ("the Players") and help them to achieve their goals.

## Duties and Responsibilities

Organisation

- Organisation of a Player's Further Education Program providing the Players with the necessary managing and organizational skills to succeed in international professional golf competitions
- Responsibility for the wildcard exchange for the various tours; securing playing opportunities for eligible Players
- Player consultancy to ensure relevant playing and practice schedules


## Communication

- Constant dialogue with the Players (and team as necessary)
- Development of an appropriate network (tournament organizers)


## Education

- Player consultancy in all aspects relevant to maximising the golf performance
- Development of appropriate support events based around the Player's needs
